| The typical day /<br>What to expect  | After handover at 8am, the patients that need to be seen<br>on the day will be split up amongst the team. During the<br>day you will see a variety of patients and will conduct<br>either an initial/core assessment for new admissions or a<br>review. You would either conduct these assessments on<br>your own, with the consultant or with one of the other<br>clinical staff (e.g., nurse practitioner or psychologist).<br>Assessments take place on the ward (for existing<br>inpatients) or in A&E (commonly the Clinical Decision<br>Unit/CDU). |
| Referrals                            | Referrals are made by paging the Liaison Psychiatry<br>team. The pagers are held by the Liaison Psychiatry<br>nurse practitioners in the Purple Room. The referrer must<br>leave their name and extension number and a member of<br>the team will get back to them. Once patients have been<br>referred, they must be assessed by Liaison Psychiatry<br>within 24 hours.   |
| Audits                               | Conducting audits and Quality Improvement Projects<br>(QIPs) are encouraged. Ask your consultant for any<br>opportunities to get involved, or you can come up with<br>your own ideas!  |

| Top Tips                             | Try and get involved as much as you can! Take the opportunity to see patients in CDU/A&E with the nurse practitioners as they tend to know more about what external services are on offer to patients.   |
